Full Circle Gives Members a Chance to Provide a Safety Net

The USTA is proud to sponsor **Full Circle**, a program to encourage individuals to provide a "safety net" for horses they bred, owned, trained, drove, cared for or just admired. The initiative is modeled after a similar program first introduced by the American Quarter Horse Association.

The **Full Circle** program allows, at no charge, anyone with interest in a horse or horses, to record their name and contact information in the USTA record of that horse. If that horse should ever become unwanted, the individual with custody of the horse at that time can contact the USTA Member Services Department to see if the horse has been enrolled in **Full Circle**.

By enrolling a horse in **Full Circle** and providing your contact information for that horse, you give the USTA permission to provide that information to an individual inquiring as to the horse's possible **Full Circle** enrollment. If you enrolled a horse, this is the point where you could be contacted by that individual, not the USTA, to help. From there, the options are up to you and the person contacting you. The USTA has no involvement or stake in the outcome.

The options may include taking the horse back, recommending or facilitating adoption or alternative career options, providing funds for care or training as a pleasure horse if you choose. The choices are varied and up to you and the current owner or contact person. If your situation has changed and you can't help—there's no obligation on your part by enrolling the horse. You can also delete your name from a horse's **Full Circle** enrollment, also at no charge.

To enroll a horse in **Full Circle**, you must have the registered name or names of the horse(s) you wish to enroll. If you do not know the horse's registered name, or think it may have been changed, please provide the tattoo or freeze brand. Also, be ready to provide all your contact information, including alternate individuals who will know how to reach you should you move or change your phone number or e-mail address after enrolling a horse in **Full Circle**.

- A detailed explanation of the proposal;

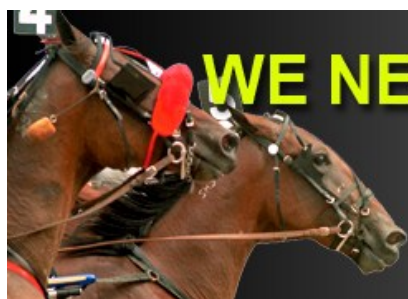
Specific wording for the rule change proposal, if possible.

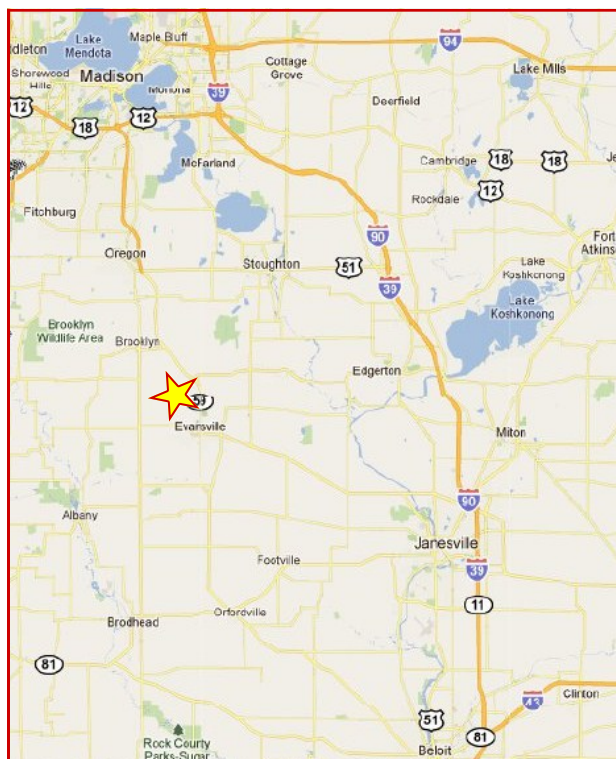

Wisconsin Harness Horse Association Board of Directors Meeting

May 15, 2011 Dane, WI

This meeting was initiated at 9:45 by President **Gabe Wand**. **Gretchen Springer, Becky Swinehart, Del Moldenhauer, Jay DeLong, Susan Schroeder, Jeanne Marquis and Historian Wayne Moldenhauer** attended. **Scott Gald** and **Rick Magee** did not attend.

Minutes from the meeting held in March were reviewed. Del moved and Gretchen seconded that they be accepted as written. All approved. See attached.

Treasurer reported that we have raised \$13,708 from our Annual Meeting, memberships, and pedal horse raffle (\$320 Horse Fair). Gabe's application for a grant from the USTA for \$1250 was accepted but not yet in the bank. This will be used for Harness the Stars Tour festivities. All race day and general liability insurance payments have been paid for the summer. Jay moved that the Financial Report be accepted. Del seconded and all approved. Attached.

Becky reported on **fundraising** activities. The calendar raffle tickets have been selling very well. We have already made our expenses. There

was a suggestion that perhaps we do a second round to extend through the holidays. The first drawing will be done after the first meet in the barn at Elkhorn and the winner's name will be posted on our Facebook page.

In the Logowear department, we now have 250 Harness the Stars Tour t-shirts to be sold for \$10 each and 250 White USTA Shirts to be tossed into the stands at each meet. Mary Puetz and Barb Smith have volunteered to manage these. Hopefully they can be carried in the gate from meet to meet. WHHA race meets are listed on the back. White USTA t-shirts will be ordered and sold for \$5.

Del has been making the necessary contacts for our **insurance**. Race day insurance is up a little (\$9) to \$184 per race day. This has been paid. He has added \$5/ month emergency road service for the starting gate. Rice Lake and Elkhorn pay us the total of their race day insurance as they do not want to require their drivers to join WHHA in order to be covered. The policy will be kept in the gate. A copy can be sent to Fair Boards/ Superintendent of Speed if they request

one.

Membership renewals have been trickling in following the last newsletter and reminder postcards sent to last year's members who had not renewed. There will be more when owners and drivers declare in for racing. There are 134 at present. Our president is hoping for more.

All viewer reports of our Saturday big crowd demonstration at the **Midwest Horse Fair** were positive. Our horses looked good especially our beautiful and fit race horses provided by Jay. Abby and Miles looked great in the antique race bike and Eric DeLong was commended for his appearance as Willie Win It. The announcer, however, was terrible. We need to consider providing our own. We have the DVD for review. Our grade for our display area was disappointing. Gretchen's Driver's Board went over well. We noticed that not only children got their pictures taken. She will add our logo so that folks looking at the pictures make the connections we're looking for. The pedal horse was a real attraction and made us a nice profit. Suggestions for more efficiency should we do this again include more e-mail communication before and after and maybe a bigger area for display. Susan or Gabe felt that their attendance at the ASAP presentations successfully moderated their efforts to paint racing owners and trainers as uncaring.

Team, Jay, Ben and Eric, Marilyn Theirrion, Susan, Gabe, Becky, Jeanne and Gretchen from the Board.

Susan's Harness the Stars Racing Tour is ready for the road. A website has a first person narrative from Fox Valley Bunns and some preview information on Shankopotomus. It will provide news about specific horses coming to the fairs. We have 3 banners. Passports will get someone a free program and fans can get them stamped at each meet for a t-shirt for attending 5 by the end of the tour. A hospitality tent easily assembled and carried in the gate will be set up near the barns. This will be home base for taking entries, greeting fans, stamping passports, the Driver's picture board, logowear, etc. From the Grant, we have a helmet camera (like Tim Tetrick!) for a one of the Fab 5 drivers to wear during a race. The Fab 5, if and when they are willing and able, will greet fans in the grandstand, be introduced at the beginning sans helmet, be interviewed, throw t-shirts, be on our Facebook page and generally let us PR them as much as we can. Gretchen will put a song for each on a CD. Our guesses as to the most agreeable are Ben DeLong, Gary Magee, Ben Gald, Wayne Weaver, and Gabe Wand. They will be approached soon.

A specific number of t-shirts will be appropriated for each meet. The announcer will be given a script to explain them as well as the passports and invitation to the Hospitality center. Elkhorn will give Time Bar Races a trial run. These will add a little variety to the program and give green horses a schooling race. Trotters will be expected to not beat 2:30 and pacers not to beat 2:20. Drivers will be given a prize (not purse money) for excellent rating.

Gretchen reported that the next **newsletter** will be out at the end of July. Half of the results will be in by then. Nicole (Wedel) has agreed to take over the **Website**. She is working with the web design and will have it up by the first meet. She will have a link to Harness the Stars on Facebook.

The **racing responsibilities** were assumed/volunteered/assigned...set up for the summer. See chart.

Gabe will ask Gregg Nebgan if he will help as Associate Judge. Mark will make portable con-

tainer boards with buckets for each race so that we don't need as many runners for Pick-a- Winner. Gabe will send a letter to Fair Boards or Superintendents of Speed to explain what we can do for them.

Tom Puetz will manage the **starting gate** during the summer, arranging for the move from meet to meet. Jay will get the oil changed. Gabe has given Morrison and Belvidere until June 1 to let him know if they want our gate.

Gabe presented the estimated **budget** for the year. See attached. Del moved that it be approved and Susan seconded. Passed unanimously.

We decided to take no formal position on the legislation forbidding any race day meds since we have no pari-mutual track in Wisconsin.

We agreed to have a check-in mid season **meeting July 30** after the Mineral Point races.

Del moved that we adjourn at 2:40 and Jay seconded. All agreed.

Charles A. Petrowitz

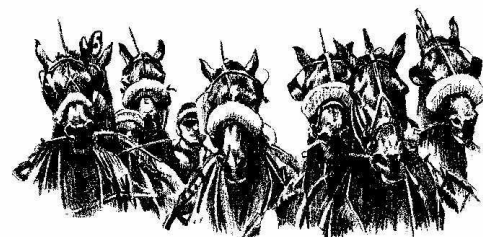
Charles A. "Charlie" Petrowitz, age 80, of Mauston passed away Saturday, May 28, 2011, at his home.

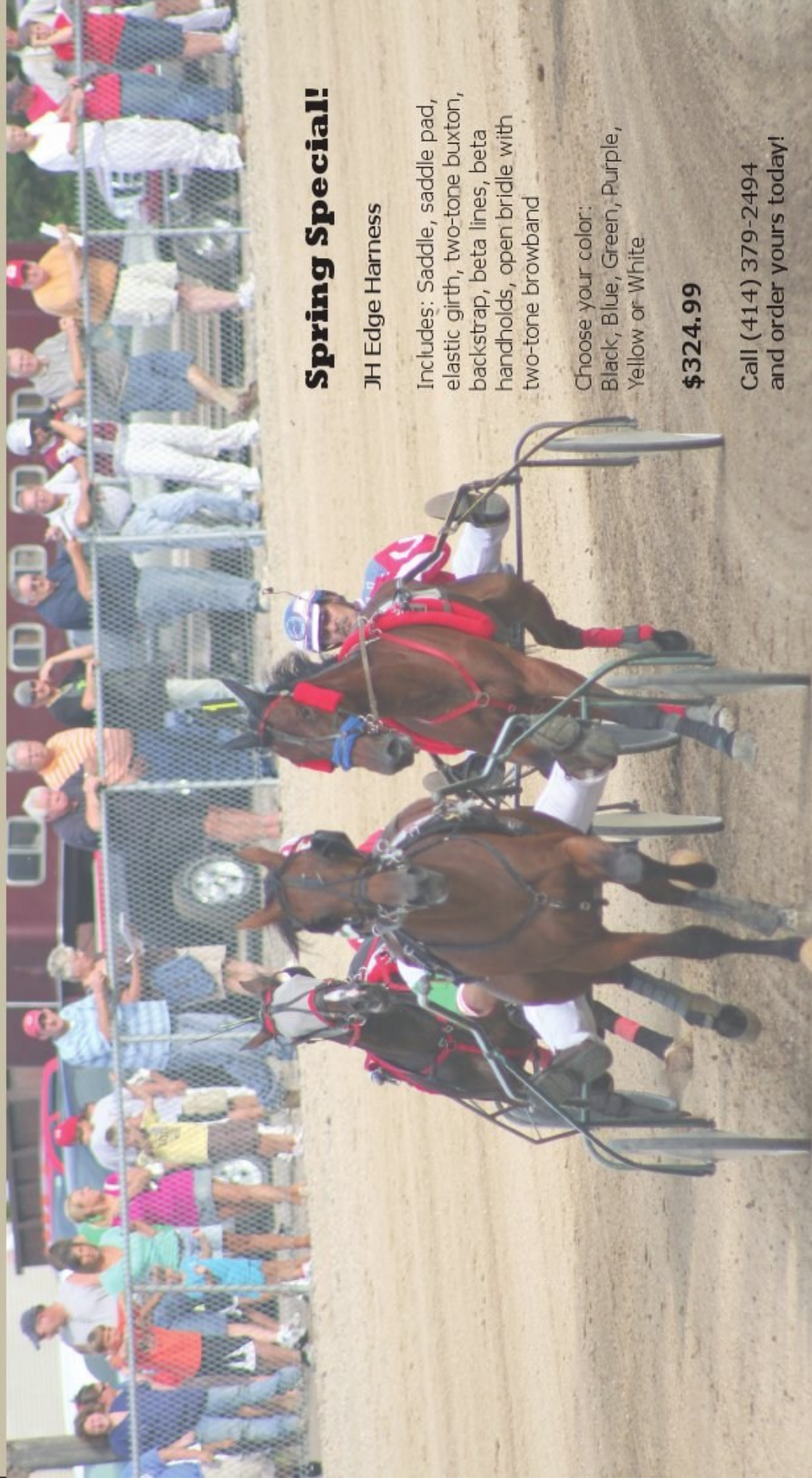

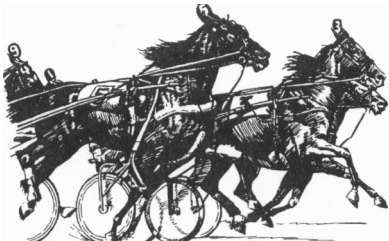
